Company Apprentice Registers

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Introduction

Funded by the British Academy, the project, ‘Communicating Women’s Work in the Historical Archive’ is a collaboration between Stationers’ Company Archivist Ruth Frendo and Dr Helen Williams of Northumbria University. It enabled the production of this guide to women’s contributions as listed in the apprenticeship records.

The Apprentice Registers are formal documents. They have been hand-copied from the more informal Apprentice Memorandum Books. You can consult the originals at the archives, or scans of the originals are available behind a paywall at Literary Print Culture, under Membership Records: Apprentice Registers.

The format of entries change over time, gradually including more information throughout the eighteenth century. The usual format is as follows: each entry begins with the name of the master, followed by the name of the apprentice with details of their father’s place of origin. The master’s occupation and place of address is then listed, including any payments made and by whom. Note that it was not unusual for trades considered outwith the parameters of the Stationers’ Company to register their apprentices here: many milliners are featured within these pages. Entries are made, aside from the occasional irregularity, in chronological order by date of binding or turnover. We provide both dates and folio numbers (the leaves are numbered only on the right hand (or ‘recto’) side, and blank on the ‘recto’ or ‘reverse’: an example of an entry on the reverse of the page marked 10 would be ‘f. 10v’).

In undertaking this task we would like to acknowledge that the collection of the below data has been undertaken using a methodology of identifying female names and kinship labels and does not therefore address those who did not conform to the period’s gendered expectations. We include all entries that feature such names and labels, not just those bound to the book trade, and include those who financed apprentices, named and unnamed, to provide a fuller picture of women’s engagement with apprenticing in the Stationers’ Company.

There are five apprentice registers in total. Apprentice Register 1 (TSC/1/C/05/01/01) deals with the period 29 Jul 1605—27 Jun 1666 but is not included here, due to the scope of the project which deals with the long eighteenth century. We begin in 1666, with Apprentice Register 2.
